JUDGMENT

Pro se defendant-appellant John DeRaffele appeals from a jury verdict finding that he violated the Fair Housing Act ("FHA") by discriminating based on familial status and by retaliating against individuals exercising rights protected by the FHA. See 42 U.S.C. § 3601, et seq. The government moves for summary disposition.

Having carefully reviewed the parties' submissions, including each and every one of the arguments sufficiently developed in appellant's brief, and relevant portions of the record, we conclude that the appeal does not present a "substantial question" and that the government's motion for summary disposition should be granted. See 1st Cir. R. 27.0(c).

The judgment of the district court is affirmed, substantially for the reasons set out by the district court in its rulings addressing the issues developed on appeal.
